## In February, OXXO will give out more than 5 thousand reusable bags in Durango

- Deliveries will take place on Saturdays 1st, 8th, 22nd and 29th of February at 16:00 to 18:00.
- OXXO offers diverse ecologic bag alternatives.

**Durango, Durango, Mexico. February 10th, 2020.** – As part of their sustainability strategy, OXXO will give its customers more than 5 thousand reusable bags on Saturdays 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>,22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of February in the Historic Center of Durango from 16:00 to 18:00 to spread awareness and promote the use of reusable bags.

"For OXXO, creating social and economic value is linked to our commitment with the conservation of the environment through innovative solutions and long-term sustainable strategies. We share with our customers in Durango the commitment to take care of the planet and we wish to contribute to the promotion of reusable bags to reduce waste and improve our environment," said Juan Carlos Reyes Freyre, Manager at OXXO Plaza Durango.

According to the Environment and Natural Resources Secretariat (SEMARNAT), each year 500 billion bags are used globally, of which half are only used once.<sup>1</sup>

This is why, aligned with their commitment with the environment and in accordance to applicable regulations, OXXO offers diverse ecologic bag alternatives, among which is the reusable bag. It is important to note that in 2019 there was a nationwide reduction of more than 200 thousand tons of plastic thanks to the use of reusable bags in every store, to the implementation of the program "without a bag, thank you", and to the elimination of bag use in some stores.

Additionally, OXXO promotes programs of waste reduction and recycling, projects of energy efficiency, use of LED illumination, reasonable consume of water, use of renewable energies in its stores and tree planting.
